Intervention Boards will now be set up bringing in wider partners to deliver the steps in the Well- being Plan

The framework for monitoring delivery and performance for the Plan has also been agreed. Quarterly performance updates will be posted on the One Newport website.

Youth Council Representation

The Chair, Councillor Debbie Wilcox, is the PSB link with Newport Youth Council (NYC) to support NYC's participation in PSB meetings, champion the views of young people and facilitate the Board's youth engagement.

The purpose of NYC representation is to ensure PSB decision making is effectively informed by the views of young people. Councillor Wilcox will be meeting with NYC to see which areas of the Well-being Plan the young people would like to be involved in.

Anti-social Behaviour Film

The Board was shown a film produced by the Council's Youth Offending Service which seeks to primary school children engaging in anti-social behaviour. The film is part of the PSB's Safe and Cohesive work.

There are opportunities to link the film with other areas of the PSB's work including Heddlu Bach – Mini Police and work around adverse childhood experiences.

Wales Audit Office Transformation Review – Pill work

Wales Audit Office (WAO) gave a presentation on the findings of a joint PSB/WAO survey of partnership work in Pill. The review looked at the effectiveness of the PSB's partnership working in Pill, including involving local people, the level of collaboration between partners, thinking long term and how far the work integrated with the priorities of partners – key aspects of the Well-being of Future Generations Act. The findings of the review were largely positive.

Work with other communities through the Well-being Plan will be informed by the experience of partnership's work in Pill.

Neighbourhood Working in Ringland

Newport City Homes, Newport City Council and Aneurin Bevan University Health Board presented proposals for collaborative development of community facilities in Ringland.

The Board agreed that partners working together and involving local people would help ensure delivery of the best scheme for the community.

Support for Public Services Boards 2018-19

Wales Government has approved regional funding for 2018-19. The funding will be used to continue the Happiness Pulse, work to support long term planning and a project to identify local action that could help Gwent cope with the negative impacts of climate change.
