

One Newport Public Services Board (PSB) - Summary of Business: 12 September 2017

Local Well-being Plan for Newport

The PSB considered progress and next steps for the development of the Local Well-being Plan which must be in place by the 3rd May 2018.

Four partner workshops are scheduled to identify key cross-cutting interventions that would span the PSB's thirteen emerging priorities and maximise the Well-being Goals. Well-being objectives will also be developed to reflect where the PSB consider their collective action could impact positively on the state of well-being of the area. There is also a need to connect local people with the plan and engagement is part of this work.

Scrutiny of the PSB

The Chair of the Performance Scrutiny Committee – Partnerships, Councillor Majid Rahman attended with his letter written to the PSB following the Committee's inaugural meeting.

This letter considered the SIP Annual Report, the Local Well-being Assessment and timetable for ongoing reports from the PSB. PSB members are also invited to attend a meeting of the Scrutiny Committee to see how it operates and present on the work they do.

Sub-groups – Terms of Reference

The Board considered a report which proposed amendments to the terms of reference (ToRs) of the PSB sub-groups, with the following agreed:

- Change of name of the Single Integrated Plan (SIP) Board to the '[One Newport Strategy & Performance Board](#)'; membership to include all statutory members with updated roles & responsibilities.
- Revised terms of reference for the [Well-being Plan Sub-group](#), the [SIP Theme Board](#) and [SIP Priority Working Group](#).
- Revised terms of reference for the [Community Engagement Group](#) subject to referencing public involvement and participation.

Further changes will be required in April to reflect the delivery requirements of the Well-being Plan.

SIP Quarter 1 Performance Report

Lead Officers for the three key themes within the SIP (Economy & Skills; Health & Well-being; and Safe & Cohesive Communities) updated the PSB on progress at the end of Qtr.1.

Pill Action Update

Supt Matthew Williams updated the Board on the range of action underway in Pill. This included a number of high profile police operations, and joint activity with partners and the community, such as Operation Absorb, which had received positive feedback.

Letter from Newport Business Improvement District

Will Godfrey reported that Newport Now (Newport Business Improvement District) had written to the PSB regarding anti-social behaviour in the city centre. Discussion on this and city centre masterplan to be arranged at the next PSB.

Information Station

Will Godfrey reported that the Council had been approached by Welsh Government to view the Information Station in the city centre as a potential location for the National Software Academy (NSA) – a Welsh Government and Cardiff University partnership project, which was expanding and needed new premises to remain in Newport.

The intention is to lease the top three floors of the building to NSA, while taking steps to ensure this doesn't impact on One Newport partnership teams.

Welsh Carbon Budgets: Call for Evidence

A PSB response, prepared and submitted by NCC and NRW ahead of the 11th September deadline was tabled for information.
