

One Newport Public Services Board (PSB) - Summary of Business: 21 November 2017

Consultation Draft of the Local Well-being Plan

The PSB has agreed the consultation draft of the Local Well-being Plan and the next steps for the plan to be in place by 3 May 2018.

It also considered advice from the Future Generations Commissioner on the development of the plan.

The draft plan includes four proposed well-being objectives, which are:

- People feel good about living, working, visiting and investing in Newport
- People have skills and opportunities to find suitable work and generate sustainable economic growth
- People and communities are friendly, confident and empowered to improve their well-being
- Newport has healthy, safe and resilient environments.

The draft plan also includes five cross-cutting interventions to deliver against the PSB's well-being objectives and priorities, and to maximise its contribution to the [seven well-being goals for Wales](#).

The proposed interventions were developed from a series of workshops attended by over 100 representatives from 30 organisations. They are:

- The Newport Offer
- Strong Resilient Communities
- Right Skills
- Green and Safe Spaces
- Sustainable Travel

A 12 week public consultation on the draft plan is now underway and will run until 18th February 2018. The PSB is keen to hear the views of as many people and organisations as possible.

City Centre Masterplan

The PSB received a presentation on the draft City Centre Masterplan with the vision of “a revitalised and vibrant heart for the city with a strong and independent identity that is rooted in Newport’s history and is forward-looking, continuing the momentum set by recent successes”

PSB members noted the importance of community engagement, of the plan being informed by the Well-being Plan and members considering the implications for their own services.
