4.	<p>SIP Performance – Quarter 2 (2017-18)</p> <p>Each of the Theme dashboards was discussed for Quarter 2.</p> <p>a) <u>Safe & Cohesive Communities Theme</u></p> <p>Chief Inspector David Morgan gave an overview of Quarter 2, with the following points raised:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Op Bang – really successful programme delivered by the ASB Theme Group. Reduction in ASB incidents and deliberate fire setting. • Pill Area Focus Plan, very successful, PSB led, operations include action days, thematic – licensing theme, alcohol licences, HMO properties. • December – Crime Prevention Theme – Mini Police – working with young people aged 10-12 to form positive young role models. Encouragement for parents to be involved from a civic duty. • Organised Crime – Terriers – Professional stage play year 8 & 9 pupils – journey of how young people have life choice to make which path they will follow – 29th January being delivered <p>Will Godfrey – test of success of Pill Area Focus Plan – can we replicate the work in other wards? Yes – ASB Theme Group asked to focus on three areas: Maesglas, Duffryn and Alway and use the same delivery mechanism.</p>

Licensing is being looked at, disorder and whether or not linked to particular licensed premises. • Youth Justice Re-offending rates – re-offending post court – high numbers relate to Op Jewels and first time entrants due to positive action carried out by Gwent Police. <p>Kier Duffin – virtual hubs and teams delivering – highlighted feedback from staff at present state there is an increased / heightened fear of working in Pillgwenlly.</p> <p>It was agreed Give a presentation to the next Strategy & Performance Board and then make a decision as to whether the information is sent to the PSB.</p> <p>b) <u>Economy & Skills Theme</u></p> <p>Beverly Owen gave an overview of Quarter 2, with the following points raised:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivery progress is currently amber – footfall counters in Commercial Street and Bridge Street – Friars Walk possibly over 7 million footfall. • Commercial Street development signed off by Welsh Gov, 27th Nov Park Place front entrance will be closed – security guard on site. • Software Academy moving into the Information Station (Cardiff University). • Lottery application for Market Arcade in process. • We are seeing an increase in developer interest. • Annual jobs fairs at Newport centre and Celtic Manor very successful. • Coleg Gwent campus at Nash to be brought into the city centre. • City Centre masterplan discussed for the first time at PSB yesterday and will be launched for consultation in January, this includes the Newport Knowledge Quarter and Newport Centre. • USW launched cyber academy in Newport, looking to launch a Cyber Wales Centre. • Business school – pop up successful in the indoor market. • Newport Marathon – new event with 4000 people signed up already. • Paralympic Games currently under development. <p>Will Beer – can we hold a series of events leading up to the marathon e.g. couch to 5k, park run?
