Key Achievements & Successes

STEP 1: PSB to become champions: Gwent ultra-low emission vehicle (ULEV) fleet feasibility study undertaken by Energy Saving Trust (including grey fleet) is complete. Organisations are improving technology to enable agile working and reduce travel. Air Quality (AQ) Supplementary Planning Guidance (SPG) is in place. AQ/ST Strategy consultation complete and adopted.

STEP 2: Create an environment where public transport, walking and cycling is prioritised: £5.2m of funding has been obtained for active travel infrastructure projects across the city. Draft ST SPG has been developed and is out to public consultation until 29/11/19. Continuation of active travel programmes in 3 schools. On street bike, hire feasibility study complete. Civic parking enforcement is now in place. Newport Bus has funding for 15 ULEV buses.

STEP 3: Encourage the use of ULEV: The Gwent wide charging point study is complete which identified appropriate locations for charging points. A funding bid was successful to install points in car parks near residential areas. ECO Stars continues to be offered to fleet operators in the city.

Plans for next quarter and the future

STEP 1: Implementation of recommendations and learning from the fleet review. Clear agile working procedures need to be developed by individual organisations. Undertake a baseline study for the Healthy Travel Charter similar to the Cardiff area and roll out a Gwent Charter by 03/20.

STEP 2: Implementation of all the infrastructure projects. ST SPG to be adopted in early 2020. Source funding for On-Street Bike Hire Scheme. Infrastructure changes in and around St Davids School to be completed by 03/20.

STEP 3: Installation of charging points in car parks near residential areas by 03/20. Continuation and expansion of ECO Stars. Investigate ULEV car share/ car club schemes.
